Clay Tree certainly ended 2015 as busy as it started with the launch of a new program at the end of November. We have started Clay Tree Employment Services, which already has ten very excited participants for whom we are endeavouring to obtain paid employment in the near future. This new program has been spearheaded by myself and Rachel Pearsall so please feel free to ask us any questions and any feedback is always welcome.

The participant Christmas party was attended by 150 participants, caregivers and family along with staff and Board members. It was a great evening. The meal had been organised by Linda Lobello and was a fabulous Christmas dinner served buffet style (myself on KP duty prior to the event). Brenda worked alongside Linda and many of the staff served at the buffet tables on the evening. Susan decorated the Cavallotti with more staff and participants and you will see her photographic skills put to good use in this newsletter. Darryl ran the cocktail bar along with Marie and Derrick was DJ for the evening. One of the highlights of the evening was the awards for long participation at Clay Tree, and Richard Ollenberger was given his 50 year award by another long standing member Richard McLellan. Elaine did her usual first class job speaking about the recipients prior to them being given their award from Mrs Armstrong who remembered many of them from the time they had been in her class. The dance floor was packed and many people said it was the best party so far, this only means we have much to live up to for next year.

The New Year has started really well and we are renovating a space for the Bridges program to move into. We are working with Vancouver Island Leadership to raise some of the funds and one of the main fundraisers for this event is a Beer n Burger evening on Friday 26th February at Old City Station Pub. The tickets are \$15 and available for purchase at Clay Tree Reception. Eventually this will lead to us being able to have a Seniors program here at Clay Tree which is much needed in the community. Team "Seed" (the name the Leadership team has chosen) have lots of great fundraising ideas and are getting lots of publicity for this project from Shaw TV and the news so "watch this space".

Prior to the above evening we have one of the best nights of the year coming up at Clay Tree on February 11t.h. It is Art from the Heart where you will see some spectacular art work that the artists at Clay Tree have created. This is a really fun evening and our auctioneer, Jeff Jorgenson will be keeping the bidding fun and fast. The tickets for this event are also on sale at Clay Tree and include light refreshments.

The formal Gala on March 12th is going to be at the Coast Bastion this year and is almost sold out. The theme is "Springtime In Paris" and the Gala committee are having regular meetings to prepare a magical and upscale evening for all the guests. As you know we raised \$23k last year so let's hope we can do the same and get that wheelchair van that Estevan badly needs.

The dates are in the newsletter and also in the Clay Tree reception area and always remember that if you need a longer or more confidential meeting, then just call reception and they have the calendars for Darryl and myself and they are free to make appointments for you at a time that is convenient for you either day or evening.

We also have some great projects lined up for 2016 and we will keep you fully informed as we move through the months.

The newsletter is produced 8 times a year and we also have our webpage and facebook being constantly updated.

Well, all that is left is for me to say a big thank you to all of you that have helped Clay Tree move on its upward path over the last year and let's just keep moving forward.








# **ARBUTUS**


