A WORD FROM THE ED



Hello to all our membership and friends of Clay tree Society,

It seems very apt that I am compiling this to you on the first day of summer. The days are longer and we all seem in good spirits when the weather is warmer.

There is so much that has been happening at Clay Tree since the last newsletter and I hope that you have been keeping up with us on a daily basis on our Facebook page.

The annual Gala that we held in March was a wonderful success and I think it is fast becoming a Nanaimo tradition (I am not sure how long you have to do something before it becomes a tradition). I am happy to let you be the first to know that next yearís Gala will be taking place on March 4th 2017 at the Coast Bastion and as Clay Tree will have been in service for 60 years next year, I will give you a hint that `Diamonds are Forever` may be a part of the theme. It will be a wonderful evening this year, so please be sure to get your Early Bird special priced tickets from Susan when they are launched in September.

A new initiative that has been recently launched is our staff training for new employees. Previously after obtaining the CSW certificate and starting work at Clay Tree, our new employees were given 6 days orientation and that was about it. When I looked at all the CARF regulations and our own policies and procedures it became clear that this just was not enough. Kelly Moore is heading a 4 week new trainee program that will operate up to 4 times each year and really give our new staff a taste of how we operate and what we expect at Clay Tree. We are now on our second training course and the feedback has been really positive.

On the Employment Bureau things are also happening with the new Pre-Employment Lifeskills course in operation and candidates having obtained work experience, interviews and some paid employment. Rachel Pearsall is heading this initiative so if you have any questions please don't hesitate to ask her, the Pre-Employment Lifeskills is being run by Linda Lobello and lasts 10 weeks and this includes adapted first aid, WHMIS and food safe along with all the other skills needed to be employed in the community.



Team Seed started the ball rolling to raise funds for our transformation of the Bridges program, as I write to you the work has begun on the kitchen and office area. Over the summer we are hoping that we will be able to have an 'open house' for you to be able to see the new program area. The renovations are running at around \$20k at the moment and although we got a fantastic sum of \$5k in from Team Seed if you would like to make any donations towards this then please contact Susan Easter.

Thank you to all that attended the AGM this year.

The tour of our programs and the 'Round The World' culinary delight theme was well received by all and the official meeting went very smoothly. After Kris Huberts (President) had completed

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his speech, I was very proud to introduce Elaine Manning to talk about our Practicum Policy and how much we are involved with all the local colleges/universities and that is an area that has really grown for us under the guidance of Elaine. Linda Lobello spoke about Lifeskills (both our regular program and pre-employment) and her passion for this always shines through. This was followed by Kelly Moore talking about the New Trainees and ended with Rachel Pearsall giving an update on Employment. The added bonus for myself was that my speech was very short and sweet and we wrapped the evening up with our newest Board member Ken Watson being voted in, all in all a great evening.

Our job seekers are excited for the opportunities that await them!




INCLUSION BC

SAVE THE BUS PA



Raise The Rates: Leave our Bus Pass Alone!

Clay Tree Society were extremely active this year in protesting outside the Parliament Buildings in Victoria. The recent changes were a little confusing so we thought we would give you a full explanation. The Government has recently abolished the \$45 a year administration fee, we see this as a small first step, but it will not address the low rates or the abject poverty of people who rely on PWD in BC.

We are urging you all to write a letter or a postcard to Minister Stillwell, here is an example of what is being sent:- (cut on dotted line, sign your name below `Sincerely` and send)

Honourable Michelle Stilwell, Minister of Social Development and Social Innovation, PO Box 9058 Stn. Prov. Govt., Victoria, B.C. V8W 9E1

Dear Minister Stilwell:

If writing you today to urge you to reverse the changes your government made in February's budget to the way People with disabilities pay for transportation and restore the freedom, mobility and a sense of dignity and self-worth for tens of thousands of vulnerable British Columbians. I join with Inclusion BC and 160 other organizations in urging you to:

- 1. Bring back the \$45 per year bus pass for people with disabilities;
- 2. Eliminate the new \$52/month bus pass fee;
- 3. Allow everyone receiving PWD benefits to keep the \$77/month increase;
- 4. Bring back the Special Transportation Subsidy and introduce a rural transportation subsidy for those living outside the areas where the Bus Pass Program and Special Transportation Sub sidy operate; and
- 5. Raise income and disability assistance significantly by October 1, 2016 to reflect the cost of living, and then index to inflation.

I respectfully ask that you leave these programs (crucial to the quality of life for People with disabilities) in place and provide a meaningful rate increase for all income assistance and disability assistance recipients.
