
Training for the new staff is being really well received and I am still hoping to open the Seniors program by the end of the year.

After the Meiji restoration, western clothes were introduced and the Japanese embraced a new arrival of attire since kimono clothes were targeted for robberies due to being unfit for running. Participants were offered the opportunity to dress in a kimono with Lorraine jumping at the first chance. ALLMAN TOWN PRIMARY



Allman Town Primary School is situated in Kingston, Jamaica. It is located in the heart of Kingston near the National Heroes Park, The Ministry of Education, and neighbors Trench Town and New Kingston. Allman Town may not be the richest neighborhood in Jamaica's capital city but walking through it I learnt of many individuals in the community striving to succeed and support others to do the same. From an individual who was awarded the Queen's Award for his outstanding community involvement and leadership, to another receiving a highly regarded scholarship to a Scottish university for her phenomenal academic achievements.

Part of this high achieving group is the Principal of Allman Town Primary who received the award for Principal of the Year 2015-2016, of all the Primary, Secondary and Tertiary educational institutions in the whole of Jamaica. While meeting with her she told me of her ambitious plans for the Primary School and its significant role in shaping the youth in the surrounding community. Thanks to Clay Tree Society's Flea Market on August 20th 2016, and 4 tables funded by our Executive Director Glenys Patmore and all those who donated to our cause (notably Margaret Gaskill) and Jen for managing the stand, I was able to make a donation to this Primary School. The Principal of the School was highly interested in what we do at Clay Tree Society and talked of the importance of including individuals of all levels of ability in the community, especially from Primary School age.

With the money she received, Allman Town Primary will be able to continue hiring a behavioral coach for their students this coming year, something they thought they would have to stop because of shortage in funding. What I learnt on my visit there is that community oriented groups such as Clay Tree Society and Allman Town Primary don't only make an impact within their own institutions but in the entire community. Nanaimo may have greater access to resources than many communities in Kingston, but what is certain is that both places benefit greatly from active community involvement by all, including the participants at Clay Tree Society! So thank you to all those who helped organize the Flea Market and bought from our stall, you contributed to a great cause!

LEMON SQUARES AND THE FLEA MARKET

Margaret Gaskill's Famous Lemon Square Recipe!

Top:

Ingredients
4 Eggs
1/4 Cup of flour
1/2 Cup of sugar
1/4 Tsp of baking Powder
1/3 Cup of Lemon Juice
1/4 Tsp of Salt
1 Tsp of Lemon Rind

Instructions 1. Beat Eggs 2. Combine all ingredients 3. Bake at 350 Degrees (F.) for 25 minutes

Optional: dust with icing sugar

Base:

Ingredients
2 Cups of flour
1 Cup of butter
1/2 Cup of Icing Sugar

Instructions
1. Mix together
2. Press into a 9x13" pan
3. Bake at 350 Degrees (F.) for 20 minutes

Tips: Use the whole lemon, and really squeeze all the juice, and use all the rind for strong lemon taste.


